ABOUT THE ARTISTS:

Pearl C. Hsiung received her BA at the University of California, Los Angeles (1997) and her MFA at Goldsmiths College, London (2004).

Hsiung makes works that are an amalgam of diverse, metaphor-laden images of transmogrified landscape-portraiture hybrids. Hsiung draws from varied sources of visual vocabulary, including generic photography books found in thrift stores, sci-fi/fantasy illustrations, medieval alchemical drawings, mass culture graphics and images culled from memory. The resulting images offer a multitude of interpretations ranging from the psycho-sexual to the anthro-geological.

Hsiung has had solo exhibitions at Max Wigram Gallery, London (2006) and Steve Turner Contemporary, Los Angeles (2007), and has been included in group exhibitions including *2006 California Biennial* and *Disorderly Conduct: Art in Tumultuous Times* (2008), both at the Orange County Museum of Art. Hsiung will be exhibiting in upcoming solo shows at Steve Turner Contemporary (2010) and at the Vincent Price Art Museum at East Los Angeles College (2011).

Edgar Arceneaux lives and works in Los Angeles, California. He received his BFA from the Art Center College of Design in Pasadena, California and his MFA from the California Institute of Arts in Valencia, California. In addition he has studied at the Skowhegan School of Painting and Sculpture in Maine and at the Fachhochschule Aachen in Germany.

Arceneaux has had solo exhibitions at Susanne Vielmetter, Los Angeles and Berlin Projects; Albion Gallery, London; Praz–Delavallade, Paris and The Studio Museum of Harlem, New York. Recent group shows include *California Biennial 2008*, *Whitney Biennial 2008* and *California Calling: Works from Santa Barbara Collections*, 1948 – 2008 at the Santa Barbara Museum of Art.
